With this classification and a well-designed ontology, the building of an efficient IT platform and an EU-wide registry is now possible.

- The three-day meeting was too long



In general, the meeting lived up to my expectations




The duration of the meeting was

Meeting staff/officials were generally helpful




The ERN-EYE team is doing its best to help participants during registration and on site at meetings. For future meetings, it will be done to the maximum so that each participant receives all the information they need.

The quality of the sound in the meeting rooms was good




Internet access was good and reliable
