







We noted that the participants were generally satisfied with the progress and organization of the General Meeting. However, the duration of two days seemed too long or too short for some of them.









The ERN-EYE team is doing its best to help participants during registration and on site at meetings. For future meetings, we will continue to do to the maximum so that each participant receives all the information they need.









The internet access and the sound were much better in Tallinn than in Mont Saint-Odile and the results of the satisfaction survey is much more positive about those points.
