OCULOPLASTIC SURGERY WORKSHOP

LIVE SURGERY CASE OVERVIEW

Five patients will undergo surgery and be discussed during the live oculoplastic surgery workshop. Four of them have congenital eyelid abnormalities. Three presents with various types of congenital or acquired ptosis, and one has congenital eyelid retraction. The fifth patient has acquired pseudoptosis following enucleation of the left eye due to retinoblastoma (Group E). The patients' ages range from 1.5 to 74 years.

SURGICAL CASES

18-year-old male Planned procedure:	Right-sided congenital eyelid retraction. Correction using tarsorrhaphy to elevate the left lower eyelid and improve palpebral symmetry.
15-year-old female Planned procedure:	Right-sided Horner syndrome (positive phenylephrine test). Unilateral Fasanella-Servat or Müllerectomy.
74-year-old female Planned procedure:	Right-sided ptosis. Resection of the levator palpebrae superioris aponeurosis.
27-year-old female Planned procedure:	Acquired ptosis after enucleation of the left eye for retinoblastoma (1999). No surgical intervention indicated.
1.5-year-old child Planned procedure	Severe bilateral congenital ptosis (levator function < 5 mm) and abnormal head posture. Bilateral frontalis sling surgery.
